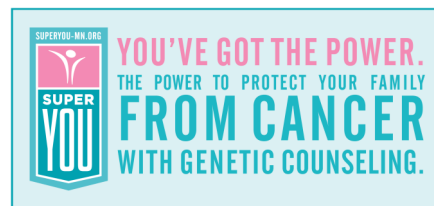

FORCE is a national nonprofit dedicated to fighting hereditary breast and ovarian cancer. With over 50 outreach groups throughout the U.S., including an active Minnesota network, FORCE programs provide outreach, education, support and advocacy on behalf of the high-risk community. FORCE was founded on the principle that no one should have to face hereditary breast and ovarian cancer alone.

The Minnesota Ovarian Cancer Alliance (MOCA) is a non-profit organization dedicated to raising awareness, providing support to women and families impacted by the disease and funding the research needed to detect ovarian cancer early and treat it properly.

MOCA was founded in 1999 by a group of ovarian cancer survivors. Since then, MOCA has grown to an organization of more than 800 survivors and more than 45,000 supporters with a full range of programs encompassing education, support and research. MOCA has awarded more than \$4 million to research projects for ovarian cancer research in Minnesota. Thanks to events like the Komen Race for the Cure, Komen has invested almost \$2 billion to fulfill their promise, working to end breast cancer in the U.S. and throughout the world through ground-breaking research, community health outreach, advocacy and programs in more than 50 countries.
