<b>Discussion</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Questions: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Should average and high risk (hereditary risk) be an issue statement or a single objective? Who do we target?</li> <li>2. How do we reflect health equity? -Our strategies will highlight policy, partner alignment, and health equity opportunities.</li> <li>3. Can an issue be that there is not good data on a specific cancer (ex: lung) screening? –Yes, it could also be an objective or strategy</li> <li>4. Are we considering the variables that contribute to the issue (ex: social determinants of health)?</li> <li>5. Can an issue be based on target populations and removing barriers to across cancer screenings?
